Message What Can You See? Part III Signs

We see signs all around us. There are road signs and advertising signs, safety signs and instructional signs. Most signs are self-explanatory. Take these for example: Stop sign, washing hands, fire exit (and opposite arrow exit) Some take a little more interpretation. Like these: Children, one way bridge. And then there are the obscure and funny ones like these...

Some of these are real warning signs. Others are just for fun. Can you tell the difference?















Signs, the real ones at least, have a clear purpose besides making us laugh. They are there to make us think, to cause us to be aware of our environment, and hopefully to encourage us to modify our behaviour should that be necessary.



Here is a good example of a, 'behaviour modification', sign. It is telling us that if we are going too quickly it is likely that the corner will be uncomfortable at best and straight up impossible at worst. So when we see a sign like this, the chances are we will check our current speed, and should it be

necessary, adjust to something suitable. Now before the speedfreaks among us leap up with comments about accuracy and necessity, the truth is that for many of us, keeping to suggestions like these lead to a smoother, safer driving experience – for both us, and our passengers.

Of course there are other signs that we casually read every day that have no words, or even obvious images. Things like the wind direction and the shape and colour of the clouds can tell us things about the weather heading our way. The state of the soil will tell us about drought conditions. And then there are the people type of signs. Signs like these. Can you decode them?



The Bible is full of signs of different kinds and has regular references to being able to read the signs. In 1 Chronicles 12 we read of the men of Issachar who understood the times and know what Israel should do. In Matthew, Jesus talks about signs, both from God, and from false prophets. We read about the sign of the Son of Man, and of Jesus performing signs. The Pharisees looked for signs and the disciples asked about signs. The people then knew that God communicated through signs of different kinds and looked for them.

So it is no surprise at all that God deliberately set the rainbow as a sign in the sky – a reminder that the great flood should never happen again. And that is because God had made a covenant with every living thing on earth. Wait, what? God made a covenant with every living creature. That includes all the animals and the birds. Every! living thing. Let's take a moment to think about that. The sign of the rainbow is to remind God that a covenant existed between God and every living thing. Kind of off the subject, but how arrogant are we to think that God is concerned primarily with humans.

Anyway, back to the sign. God uses signs, in this case a rainbow, as reminders of promises made and kept. So when we see a rainbow, it is a reminder of what once happened, a reminder that it will never happen again, and a reminder not only to us, but to God.

And then the sign in our reading from Mark. Jesus, coming up from being baptised sees heaven torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice from heaven says, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am

well pleased." What a beautiful way for a Father to affirm his son. Makes me kind of wish I could do something like that for my kids.

Of course, God's singular sign to us is in the person of Jesus. Jesus was born, lived, died, rose again and then ascended into heaven. He was fully, 100% human, and somehow, in a way we don't understand he was fully, 100% God at the same time. And he came to us as a gift and as a sign. We weren't looking for him, we weren't counting on him turning up, we didn't even know it was a possibility. And yet, because he loved us, even in our ignorance, he came. It's kind of funny in one sense because it's like he sneaks up on us, not to leap out at us with an almighty, 'BOO!' No, he sneaks up so as not to frighten us. To surprise us with love and grace. There are signs of this incredible love everywhere we care to look. Most of those signs can be explained away if you care to do so. Even life itself is adequately explained through evolution. Yet if you look a little deeper, it's not about explaining the how of things, it is about asking the why. Why me? Why this? And God says, 'Read the signs. What can you see?' Then with little effort we can see that all the signs point to a simple message from God, through Jesus. 'I Love You.'

We Pray

God of signs and images, as we think about what we see around us that points to you we are humbled and amazed that you would make the effort to connect with us, to come to us and surprise us with your grace. We confess that we have not been too good at seeing the signs. Even when we do see them, we like to misinterpret them to make ourselves seem more important than we really are. Help us to learn to see the most wonderful sign of all in the person of Jesus. Help us to interpret the sign of Jesus as you have intended. Help us to be constantly surprised by your love and your grace. In Jesus name. Amen.

Thank you for the signs that life is still there, emerging and changing: for the dahlias brightening many a Kiwi garden; and for the smallest reptile in the world found, still surviving, in Madagascar.

Yet, that reminds us of the need to care for all our environment; we pray about the people who trade in, steal, kill, collect the rarest and the most important. As experts investigate a probably poisoning of endangered Andean condors, in Bolivia, we pray for understanding of the remarkable interdependence we have with our world. Similarly, for the area of the Tapovan Dam, Uttarakhand state, India, where 170 people are still missing following the dam collapse caused by a glacier burst. The United States is experiencing its worst avalanche season and related deaths in a 100 years and this pattern is repeating

elsewhere in so many aspects of nature. We give thanks for the multiplicity of often small-scale ventures trying to stabilise and reverse this trend of climate warming affecting all our weather systems and therefore life for us all.

Lord, in your mercy: Hear our prayer.

As the news from the WHO report is that the pandemic is unlikely to be caused by a virus escape from a lab in Wuhan, China, we pray that Governments pause to reflect then act on the findings.

We pray for:

- the people of Tanzania as their Government shows how to make smoothies to protect from Covid-19.
- for the people of Ghana whose Parliament will be closed for 3 weeks following a virus outbreak.
- for the fake news from anti-vaccinators focussing on ethnic and minority groups in so many countries including sadly even by missionaries to tribes in São Francisco reservation in the state of Amazonas, Brazil.

With so few countries able to sequence and identify new strains we pray for the scientists now faced with the new, possibly annual, struggle to update vaccines.

Lord, in your mercy: Hear our prayer.

- As we hear of one child and her mother, from El Salvador, held for over 500 days in an immigration centre in the US, we recognise that if this happens once it happens again and again. So we pray for justice.
- for the Amazon workers fighting to found a union in Bessemer, Alabama, USA, we pray for justice
- for the creative artists in the music industry, we pray for justice as Universal, the world's biggest music label seeks to expand even further.

So much biodiversity, Lord, that it's easier to stick with fake news – for what is human-made can be understood by people. We thank you that in your mercy you hear our prayers.

We pause for a moment to offer our prayers for those we know and love. Grant us the ability to be your answers for each other.
