The Peace

Reading 1 Matthew 6:19-24

¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰ but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

²² "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light; ²³ but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

²⁴ "No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

Reflection 1

Idioms. I think I have talked about idioms before, but I also think they are worth revisiting. An idiom is a collection of words that together mean something quite different to what those words actually say. For example: 'Don't put all your eggs in one basket' or 'Every cloud has a silver lining.' Nobody thinks that putting all your eggs in a basket is a bad thing. But we know that it is a reference to not taking unnecessary risks. And clouds don't actually have silver linings, rather it is an injunction to look for the good amongst the bad. Any non-native speaker of a language will readily tell you that idioms are the curse of learning a new language because having learnt the meanings of all the words they still have no idea what you are talking about when you use an idiom. Imagine talking to a new immigrant from Syria and telling them you were calling it a day before heading home. They would still be wondering what was going on as you got in your car and drove off.

What we don't think about when we read the Bible is that it is full of idioms, and we are often like the new immigrant staring after the disappearing car and wondering what is going on. A good example of this is one I am sure we have all worked out by now. Jesus tells us, in Matthew 7:6 that we should not cast our pearls before swine. On the surface, that seems obvious enough – the swine aren't going to appreciate pearls in any way, shape or form. But as we know, Jesus isn't talking about pearls or pigs. He is talking about not wasting our breath explaining things to people who have no interest in listening. Interestingly, the first part of the sentence is, 'Do not give what is holy to dogs;' Dogs in the New Testament is idiomatic for gossips. So we could translate this verse along the lines of, 'Treat holy ideas and conversation with the seriousness they deserve.'

Which leads us to our reading this morning. Now, there are multiple idioms in this short reading. I am going to focus on just the one, in verses 22 to 24 – The eye is the lamp of the body. Now let's be honest here. The words of this brief parable make no sense to us. What's more, I know that I have preached on this scripture before knowing the idiom and did a pretty poor job of it. So, with a little more information the words take on a whole new meaning.

In the context of the Hebrews of the time the idea of the eye as the lamp of the body was a way of talking about how generous a person was. We have a sense of it when we talk about the green-eyed monster of jealousy. When you had a healthy eye you were generous. When your eye was unhealthy you were greedy. So Jesus was saying that a generous person was full of light (another idiom that referred to understanding) and a greedy person was full of darkness or ignorance. His listeners would have understood this implicitly because it was a part of how they spoke.

When taken in the context of the paragraphs before and after we can see that Jesus is speaking to an insidious evil that every one of us faces in some way. I like to refer to it as the worship of stuff. Some people take this worship of stuff to an extreme, building up collections of houses and cars and artwork as if by having sufficient they can ward off the rest of the world. Most of us don't have that option. But it doesn't mean we are any less susceptible to the dangers. Holding onto stuff that make us feel safe, and more secure isn't a bad thing in and of itself until we begin to allow that stuff in the way of our relationship with God. Without us even realising it is happening we begin to find that in place of generosity we begin to grasp. Often it is easy to justify — I need that nest egg for a rainy day, I need that stuff just in case something happens. Then, when someone with need comes along, we struggle to hand over those things that we have become attached to.

Jesus is telling us here that to have a healthy relationship with God we need to have a healthy relationship with stuff – in other words we need to be generous.

I have this feeling that when we give thought to being creators it trains us to be generous. To be generous with who and how we are as well as with what we have. Think of it this way. How useful is a smile that nobody sees? Smiles work best when we give them away. It's no good simply thinking about visiting someone or calling them on the phone. We need to actively get up and visit or get on the phone and call. If our creating means mowing the lawn then we have to get out the lawnmower and get mowing. Likewise with any other kind of creating. And here's the thing - as we create we are giving, we are being generous, because in adding good to the world suddenly others begin to benefit. Not only that, the more we create the better we get at it. As that happens we store up treasure in heaven.

Reflection 2

I don't want to spend a whole lot of time here because I think the reading speaks for itself. To my thinking everything about what Paul is saying here is about generosity and creating. Think about the attitude that is created in you when you rejoice. Think about the attitude that is created in those around you when you rejoice. Think of the last time you were really, really excited. How did you feel? How did the people around you feel? We are generous to others when we are gentle and begin to create in them a similar gentleness. When we bring our requests to God we create something that can begin to conquer worry. As anxiety is conquered we are empowered to reach out to others and support and encourage them in their fears.

When we think about those things that are true and honourable and just and pure and pleasing and commendable and excellent and worthy of praise we begin to create a sense of being within ourselves that urges creating along with God, that presses us to be generous with everything about us. I'm not going to say much more here. Instead, I am going to put that list of things to think about up on the screen, one at a time, and invite you to think about something you know about that represents the idea.

Pleasing

Commendable

Worthy of praise

How are you feeling now? I may be wrong, but I suspect that you are feeling pretty good. And out of that you can consider how to be generous. How to be a co-creator with God.
